

State Law Requires:

1. Each dog be immunized against rabies, proof of which be furnished to the local department of health, prior to the issuance of a dog license.
2. The Governor signed into law A-1917, a separate animal population control program, that requires an additional \$ 3.00 surcharge on all licenses for non-spayed and non-neutered dogs.
3. All animal bites **MUST** be reported to the local Department of Health **IMMEDIATELY!**
4. Animals involved in bites **MUST** be **QUARANTINED** for not less than ten (10) days, or longer as the Department of Health may require. At the end of the quarantine, said animal must be examined by a licensed vet, who shall send written certification to the local Health Department that said animal in his opinion is either free or not free of rabies.
