



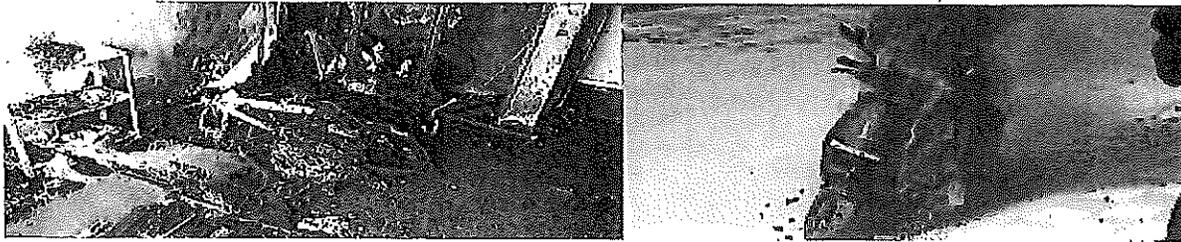
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E-BIKE AND E-SCOOTER SAFETY TIPS



The popularity of electric bikes and scooters has taken off over the past few years. Lithium-ion batteries are usually the source of power for both, and if not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch fire and explode. Lithium-ion battery fires also give off toxic gases and burn extremely hot.

Please follow the following safety tips for E-Bikes and E-Scooter devices

- Only purchase and use devices, batteries, and charging equipment that are listed and labeled by a nationally recognized testing lab. (UL, ETL, CSA)
- Always follow the instructions from the manufacturer.
- Only use the original battery, power adapter, and power cord that came with the device.
- Never use unapproved batteries or chargers as they can overheat and catch fire.
- Never charge a device with an extension cord or power strip as the lithium-ion battery requires a large amount of electrical current that can overheat extension cords or strips.
- Do not keep charging the device after it is fully charged.
- Never charge the device overnight or leave a device charging while un-monitored.
- Do not overload any electrical circuits.
- Keep batteries at room temperature.
- Do not store batteries in direct sunlight or inside hot vehicles.
- Keep batteries away from children and liquids.
- Do not store E-Bikes, Scooters or batteries in your home or apartment.
- Keep devices away from exit doors and means of egress.
- Do not store E-Bikes, Scooters or batteries near heat sources such as space heaters, radiators, furnaces, etc.
- Only have devices repaired by a qualified professional.
- Do not put lithium-ion batteries in the trash.
- Do not use devices that are leaking, generating excessive heat or have unusual odors.
